

DEVELOPMENTAL SKILLS

Does your child demonstrate problems or difficulties in any of the following areas?

Language/Speech

Has difficulty pronouncing words
Difficulty being understood by others
Limited speaking skills
Has difficulty or does not respond when spoken to
Does not babble, coo or talk

Hearing

Inappropriate response or no response to sound
Chronic ear problems

Vision

Unable to see things close up and/or far away
Avoids eye contact
Unable to follow or focus on objects
Unable to recognize people/objects
Squints eyelids together
Rubs eyes often

Cognitive/Learning

Does not understand direction or instructions
Does not play or relate to others
Does not identify common objects

Motor/Physical Development

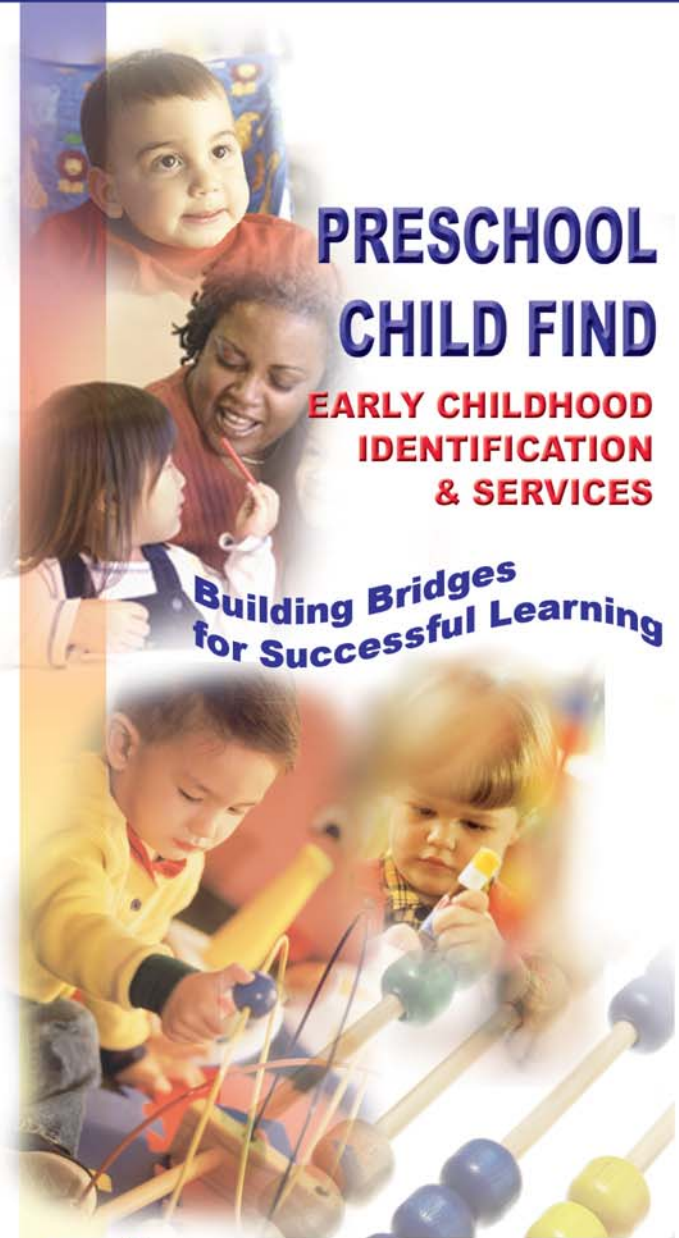
Uneven or no movement
Shows no interest in toys
Physically overactive or passive
Clumsy, makes lots of mistakes
Limited strength, vitality or alertness

Behavior

Restless
Need for constant movement
No understanding of real dangers
Experiences drastic mood swings

Self Help

Does not try to feed self
Rarely expresses wants or desires
Shows little or no independence
Gives up too easily
Depends on others to care for personal needs

Children grow and develop at different rates. Although concerns in one or two developmental skill areas may not be serious, it is important to monitor your child's development. When delays are identified, early intervention is important to meet the individual needs of the child. Screening for possible delays can identify areas of concern that may lead to services to help your child.

Fairfax County Public Schools provides free screening for students 20 months to five years of age whose families have concerns related to the development of language/speech, hearing, vision, cognitive/learning, motor/physical, behavior, or self help development.
